

### **Votive Codes**

#	The Mass of any saint listed in the latest edition of the Martyrology for today—even a saint added after 1962—may be celebrated as a votive 'festive Mass' (rubrics 301ff): i.e. with Gloria and No Creed.
	Furthermore, if such a festive Mass is celebrated, then today's office may also be of the saint celebrated therein. Such an office should be celebrated as an 'Ordinary office': i.e. as for a 3rd-class feast, with one nocturn and the <i>Te Deum</i> at Mattins. For the third reading of the nocturn, one should use the fourth reading from the appropriate common.
	The symbol '#' is only found on days of the third class. Today's day, if displaced by a votive festive Mass (and a corresponding office), should be commemorated at the Mass if it is low (and at Lauds). Other commemorations in the day's calendar are likewise kept in the votive Mass (and office), but the total number of commemorations must not exceed two.
	There is no limit to the number of votive festive Masses said today, nor need they all be the same.
†	Any votive Mass may be celebrated today as a 4th-class Mass. This Mass may be any of the votive Masses given in the missal or an approved appendix; or the Mass of any saint in the latest edition of the Martyrology or an approved supplement thereto.
	The creed is not said in 4th-class votive Masses. The Gloria is said only on:  —Masses 'of the Angels' (Missae de Angelis);  —Masses of Our Lady celebrated on a Saturday.
	Commemorations in the day's calendar are said at low votive Masses of this class.
	There is no limit to the number of 4th-class votive Masses said today, nor need they all be the same.
‡	As for '†' above, but in addition any number of 4th-class Masses for the dead (the 'daily' Masses for the dead) may be celebrated. Commemorations in the day's calendar are not kept in Masses for the dead.
IH	One third-class Votive Mass of the Immaculate Heart of Mary may be celebrated today.
	Gl No Cr Pr of the BVM <i>Et te in Veneratione</i> Commemoration of any displaced third-class day at low Mass. Other commemorations in the day's calendar are also said at low Mass, but the total number of commemorations must not exceed two.
JCHP	One third-class Votive Mass of Jesus Christ the Eternal High Priest may be celebrated today.
	Gl No Cr Pr of the Most Holy Sacrament or Common Pr Commemoration of any displaced third-class day at low Mass. Other commemorations in the day's calendar are also said at low Mass, but the total number of commemorations must not exceed two.

JCHP*	One third-class Votive Mass of Jesus Christ the Eternal High Priest may be celebrated today, unless one has already been celebrated in the same church this month. Details as above.	
SH	Two third-class Votive Masses of the Sacred Heart of Jesus may be celebrated today.	
	Gl No Cr Pr of the Sacred Heart Commemoration of any displaced third-class day at low Mass. Other commemorations in the day's calendar are also said at low Mass, but the total number of commemorations must not exceed two.
